Moonshine and Madness Tour - Long before Las Vegas acquired the nickname, Louisville enjoyed the dubious reputation as America's Sin City because of the decadence associated with its distilleries, tobacco houses and horse races. Today, ghostly legends from its heyday live on. Treat your group to a tour of the Old Louisville of the Roaring 20s and the Fabulous 30s when flappers, moon shiners and gangsters kept the neighborhood hopping with scandal and intrigue.



Belle of Louisville - Enjoy a scrumptious dinner aboard a treasured National Historic Landmark. The Belle is over 100 years old and is the oldest operating steamboat in the nation. Sit back and take in the marvelous views of Louisville as your cruise along the Ohio River.



Kentucky Peerless Distilling Company-Family owned and operatred since 1889, this state-of-the-art distillery in downtown Louisville features the only Bourbon Rickhouse in the city. Learn about the in's and out's of what it takes to make bourbon and moonshine. Groups will also have the chance to taste some of the smoothest 'shine ever in the KY Peerless tasting room.

DAY THREE



Kentucky Derby Museum and Churchill Downs Backstretch Breakfast - Begin the day at two of the most iconic and beloved Kentucky institutions. Enjoy a traditional Southern breakfast as you watch the morning workouts of some of the finest thoroughbreds in the world. Tours the museum that is dedicated to the "fastest two minutes" in sports,"-- the Kentucky Derby.



Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory Tour the World- famous bat factory. Admire the world's largest baseball bat before going inside to see how Louisville Sluggers are made. Have an all-star experience by swinging a bat just like Babe Ruth's, facing down a 90 mph fastball and sharing a dugout with Mickey Mantle.



Flame Run & Mark Payton Glass Center at Glassworks - Flame Run occupies the hot shop, a welding shop, and operates a glass gallery and gift shop. While the Mark Payton Glass Center also continues to develop "edutainment" opportunities in the Walk-In Workshop, tours, flameworking experiences, and a gallery containing flameworked glass, flat glass and jewelry.



Muhammad Ali Center - Preserving the legacy of Louisville's most famous native son Muhammad Ali, visitors experience state of the art interactive exhibits and a biographical storyline of Ali's values: respect, confidence, conviction, dedication, spirituality and giving.



Evan Williams Bourbon Experience The Evan Williams Bourbon Experience on Louisville's historic "Whiskey Row," is a 15,000 square foot facility featuring an artisanal distillery, tours and tastings. This state-of-theart distillery celebrates the legacy of Evan Williams, Kentucky's first distiller and the namesake of Heaven Hill's flagship Bourbon brand.



Louisville Mega Cavern - This manmade cavern was once a limestone pit mine. For the past 50 years, this space has served many purposes. Most notably, it would have been the largest civil defense shelter used in the event of a nuclear disaster during the Cuban Missile Crisis. Now, years later, this mine has been turned into a one of a kind underground attraction that includes a historic tram, a zipline tour and a bike park.



Dinner at the Claudia Sander's Dinner House - The Claudia Sanders Dinner House where an air of Southern Hospitality and cooking combined with old fashioned, family style service still remain. The restaurant was named for the Colonel's Wife, Claudia, and is sometimes referred to as "The Colonel's Lady."
