Learn about the history of Louisville and see various points of interest, including unique architectural features throughout downtown Louisville.



KentuckyShow!/Kentucky Science Center The KentuckyShow! is a 32-minute multimedia production that showcases the people, places, sights and sounds of the Commonwealth. Narrated by Kentucky native Ashley Judd, this show gives visitors a sense of what an utterly unique and special place Kentucky is. After the show, discover a place where children and adults alike explore exciting and interactive exhibits that engage the hands, the mind and the imagination throughout the Kentucky Science Center.

Bristol Bar & Grille - Enjoy lunch at one of Louisville's original restaurants. A true local favorite, the Bristol Bar & Grille has been around for 37 year.



Muhammad Ali Center - Preserving the legacy of Louisville's most famous native son Muhammad Ali, visitors experience state of the art interactive exhibits and a biographical story line of Ali's values: respect, confidence, conviction, dedication, spirituality and giving.



Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory Tour the World- famous bat factory. Admire the world's largest baseball bat before going inside to see how Louisville Sluggers are made. Have an all-star experience by swinging a bat just like Babe Ruth's, facing down a 90 mph fastball and sharing a dugout with Mickey Mantle.



Frazier History Museum - Roam three floors of history that tell the tales of pivotal moments in history that shaped many nations. Sit back and enjoy one of the many first-person costumed historical interpretations.



Belle of Louisville - Enjoy a scrumptious meal aboard a treasured National Historic Landmark. The Belle is over 100 years old and is the oldest operating steamboat in the nation. Sit back and take in the marvelous views of Louisville as your cruise along the Ohio River.

Kentucky Derby Museum and Churchill Downs Backstretch Breakfast - Begin the day at two of the most iconic and beloved Kentucky institutions. Enjoy a traditional Southern breakfast as you watch the morning workouts of some of the finest thoroughbreds in the world. Tours the museum that is dedicated to the "fastest two minutes" in sports,"-- the Kentucky Derby.



Louisville Mega Cavern - An underground adventure awaits in a 17 mile man-made cavern below the city of Louisville. One of the largest caverns in the U.S., the Mega Cavern is home to four attractions that include a tram tour, a zip line tour and a bike park.



Louisville Zoo - Enjoy lunch at the Louisville Zoo and then explore one of the region's most popular attractions. Come face-to-face with a polar bear in Glacier Run, meet the gorillas in the Gorilla Forest or talk to one of the zookeepers about conservation.



WaterWorks Museum - Follow 150 years of the Louisville Water Company and trace Louisville's water evolution to become one of America's most innovative water systems. The museum features hundreds of archival photographs, pieces of the original water system, films showing the impact of the water system on Louisville, and tour one of the giant steam engine rooms.



Lincoln Memorial at Waterfront Park -

Take an unforgettable tour of Louisville through the eyes of Lincoln. Abraham Lincoln comes to life before your eyes through a first-person historical actor. Plus, you can take a walk around Waterfront Park's Lincoln Memorial, sculpted by nationally and internationally known artist Ed Hamilton.



Derby Dinner Playhouse - Enjoy a delicious Southern-style dinner and an evening performance at Derby Dinner Playhouse. For over 40 years, the theatre has delighted audiences with its productions of Broadway musicals and light-hearted comedies.
