DOWNTOWN WAYFINDING

Depending on your starting location and your end destination, within Downtown Louisville, here are a few routes to help you navigate. Please keep in mind, road closures are constantly changing, due to the transformation taking place in our city, but the best way to stay up to date and find the fastest route, is via the free WAZE App. WAZE is available for download via iTunes, Google Play and the Windows Store.

FROM THE SOUTH/LOUISVILLE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT:

Traveling on I-65 Northbound toward Downtown/Louisville/Indianapolis. Take the Brook Street (**Exit 136B**). Go straight on S. Brook Street and you can turn left on Muhammad Ali Blvd, Jefferson St. or Main St.

FROM THE NORTH:

Traveling on I-65 S, merge onto I-64 W (**Exit 137**) immediately after crossing the Kennedy Bridge over the Ohio River.

1. Take 3rd St./River Rd (**Exit 5B**) and you have the options to turn right on River Road, Main St. or turn left on Market St.
2. Take Jefferson St. (**Exit 136C**). Veer left onto Brook St. or veer right and continue on Jefferson St.

FROM THE EAST:

Traveling on I-64 W, take 3rd St./River Rd (**Exit 5B**), and you have the options to turn right on River Road, Main St. or turn left on Market St.

FROM THE WEST:

Traveling on I-64 E, take 9th St./Roy Wilkins Ave (**Exit 4**) and you can turn left onto W. Market Street, Liberty St, Chesnut St or W. Broadway.

FROM I-71 SOUTHBOUND:

Merge onto I-64 W (**Exit 1A**) toward St. Louis. Take 3rd St./River Rd (**Exit 5B**) and you have the options to turn right on River Road, Main St. or turn left on Market St.

CURRENT STREET CLOSURES:

-From Market Street to Jefferson Street
- 4th Street**
-From Market Street to Jefferson Street



Mayor Greg Fischer, the Office of Performance Improvement, and the Public Works Department have developed a partnership with Waze, the world's largest community-based traffic and navigation app. Waze is expected to dramatically improve traffic conditions in Metro Louisville by giving drivers the ability to share real-time traffic and road information. Louisville becomes the fifth city to team with Waze by reporting road closures and construction. The Metro Louisville government will now be able to more effectively alert citizens and businesses about construction, accidents or special events, like community runs, walks and parades. The city is now sending all its road closure information directly to Waze, which displays it on an easy-to-use and easy-to-see-and-understand mobile app that can be downloaded on smart phones, tablets or in car navigation systems.
